1. Introductions/Agenda Review/Review of Task Force

- a. New and existing members introduced themselves and we reviewed our agenda and the structure of the Meth Prevention Network and the strategies of the Safe Neighborhoods Task Force. This was Dennis's first meeting as Thom Alena just resigned in the past couple of weeks. Chairman Ken Bambrink was unable to get back from Los Angeles in time for the meeting

2. Paraphernalia Ordinances and Enforcement Strategies

a. Butch Arnoldi distributed a survey report dated March 3, 2008 completed by SO staff on all areas patrolled by the SO Dept on likely outlets for sale of pipes typically used for smoking methamphetamine and marijuana. Seven stores were identified that had a significant supply of pipes for sale. Don Deming from LPD reported no known sales outlets for pipes in Lompoc. Discussion was held regarding the development of a specific action plan to take to the Leadership Council on March 12. It was decided to present a preliminary action plan that would see that Action items one and two were completed and complete the details of #3. Action step 4 was added:

4. Drug Endangered Children Action Plan Update
